Olympic Snowboarder Maddie Mastro Escorts Dog to US, Rescued from Dog Meat Trade in South Korea

Olympian serves as flight volunteer, brings dog to LAX to find loving home through The Barking Lot rescue

SAN DIEGO, Calif., February 26, 2017 — The Barking Lot announced today Olympic snowboarder, Maddie Mastro is serving as a flight volunteer to bring a rescue dog to the US, saved from the dog meat trade (DMT) in South Korea. Mastro, competing in PyeongChang, and aware of the plight of the DMT dogs, contacted Save Korean Dogs, and offered to bring one of the DMT dogs back with her to LAX. Save Korean Dogs (SKD) works tirelessly to shut down dog meat farms and give dogs a second chance at a happy life. In partnership with The Barking Lot, SKD transports DMT dogs to the US for adoption. Since partnering in October 2017, The Barking Lot has taken in 10 dogs from SKD that were saved from slaughter.

Finding out how she could make a difference, Mastro, one of the youngest US Olympians (who just turned 18 last week), even changed her original flight back to the US at her own expense, so she could fly on a dog friendly carrier in order to escort a dog named Jadu for The Barking Lot rescue. She hopes to inspire others to have compassion and play even a small role in helping end cruelty to man's (or girl's) best friend. As Mastro returns from her Olympic debut, she will come home to three rescue dogs of her own: "I'm happy to have this opportunity to be a part of helping these dogs, even if it's just one. I encourage others to get involved to help save these dogs and give them a chance at having a loving/caring family of their own."

Save Korean Dogs, led by Nami Kim, works with activist groups in several cities in South Korea, on the front lines in the battle against the Korean dog meat trade. Working to save as many dogs as possible from this barbaric cruelty, the team also campaigns vigorously and works to educate people on these horrors. SKD also engages in dialogue with the government for legislation change and removing dogs from the livestock list. To view a video of Kim shutting down a 300-dog meat farm, please view:

SKD is a very small activist group that operates out of a sanctuary, located in Gimpo city, one-two hours north of Seoul, in the midst of paddy fields. All the dogs are 100% dog meat trade survivors rescued from meat farms and slaughterhouses. The dogs stay at the sanctuary while receiving veterinary care and treatment to prepare them for a new life and a second chance (www.savekoreandogs.org).
